

Shopping in Vienna

The main shopping areas in Vienna's historic city center are Kärntner Strasse, Graben, Kohlmarkt, and the Goldenes Quartier on Tuchlauben. Exclusive stores representing some of the world's biggest international fashion and jewelry brands can be found here, side by side with traditional Viennese boutiques. Outside the first district, Mariahilfer Strasse is the capital's top

shopping hotspot – the stores lining the side streets off the main drag are also worth a look. Generally speaking, the stores on Vienna's shopping streets are open Monday to Friday from 09:00 to 18:30 and from 09:00 to 17:00 or 18:00 on Saturday. Shopping centres do not close until 20:00 on Thursdays and Fridays.

Exhibition: Women artists of the Wiener Werkstätte

In contrast to their famous male colleagues, most notably Josef Hoffmann, Koloman Moser, and Dagobert Peche, little attention has been paid to the women artists of the Wiener Werkstätte to date. Over 800 exhibits offer an insight into the almost unknown yet radical female design in Vienna between 1900 and 1930 which was involved in constituting the unique position of the Wiener Werkstätte between Art Nouveau and Bauhaus.

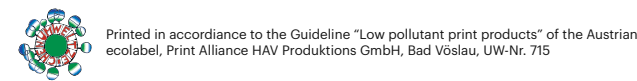
Exhibition: Lady with Fan. Gustav Klimt's Last Works

Discounts with the Vienna City Card



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The Official City Card

Enjoy the freedom that comes with full mobility! The Vienna City Card offers you free travel on public transport, as well as countless discounts when visiting museums, tourist attractions, and shopping, for the duration of your stay. You can also add Airport Transfer with City Check-In or a Hop-On Hop-Off tour to your card. Accompanying children travel free.

The Vienna City Card is available from €17 at your hotel, a Tourist Info, Wiener Linien ticket offices, and at shop.vienna.info



Accessibility

The capital's public transportation and stations have been adapted for people with restricted mobility. All underground stations and trains offer step-free access. Vienna's buses are all step-free low-floor vehicles. The electronic displays at tram stops let passengers know when the next wheelchair-friendly tram is coming

by displaying a small wheelchair symbol next to the service number. Braille maps of the city are available from Tourist Info Vienna on Albertinaplatz. One counter is equipped with an inductive hearing loop. Wheelchair users can make use of an accessible service point equipped with a tablet.

Wi-Fi

Use one of around 400 free Wi-Fi hot spots in the city, e.g.:

- in City Hall Square, at Stephansplatz, in the MuseumsQuartier
- at Naschmarkt, in the Prater, and on the Danube Island
- in railway stations and many subway stations

You also have free Wi-Fi access

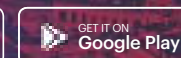
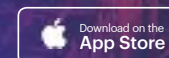

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Tips for an unforgettable trip
to Vienna



City Walk I

Starting at the **Vienna State Opera** 1 walk along Kärntner Strasse until you reach the capital's best-known landmark, **St. Stephen's Cathedral** 2. Do not miss: the **Mozarthaus Vienna** 3. Next, head for the imperial **Hofburg** 4 via Graben and Kohlmarkt. Cross Heldenplatz and pause to admire the views of the Parliament building and City Hall. Go through the Burgtor towards the **Kunsthistorisches Museum** 5 and the **MuseumsQuartier** 6 which contains the Leopold Museum, Kunsthalle Wien, and mumok – museum of modern art. Continue downhill along Getreidemarkt towards the golden dome of the **Secession** 7 building. Take the underpass leading through Karlsplatz underground station passing the Künstlerhaus en route to the **Musikverein** 8, home of the Vienna Philharmonic. From here you can see the Baroque **Karlskirche (Church of St. Charles)** 9 church with its striking dome (on the other side of the road). Now proceed along Lothringerstrasse, past the **Konzerthaus** 10, bound for Stadtpark with the Kursalon and the golden **Johann Strauss Monument** 11. Then cross the Ring to Seilerstätte and the **House of Music** 12. Finally walk back towards Kärntner Strasse, passing Tourist Info Vienna on your way to the **Albertina** 13.



Sights Outside the City Center

Schönbrunn Palace: Habsburg summer residence; directions: U4, Station: Schönbrunn

Schönbrunn Zoo: The world's oldest zoo; directions: U4, Station: Hietzing

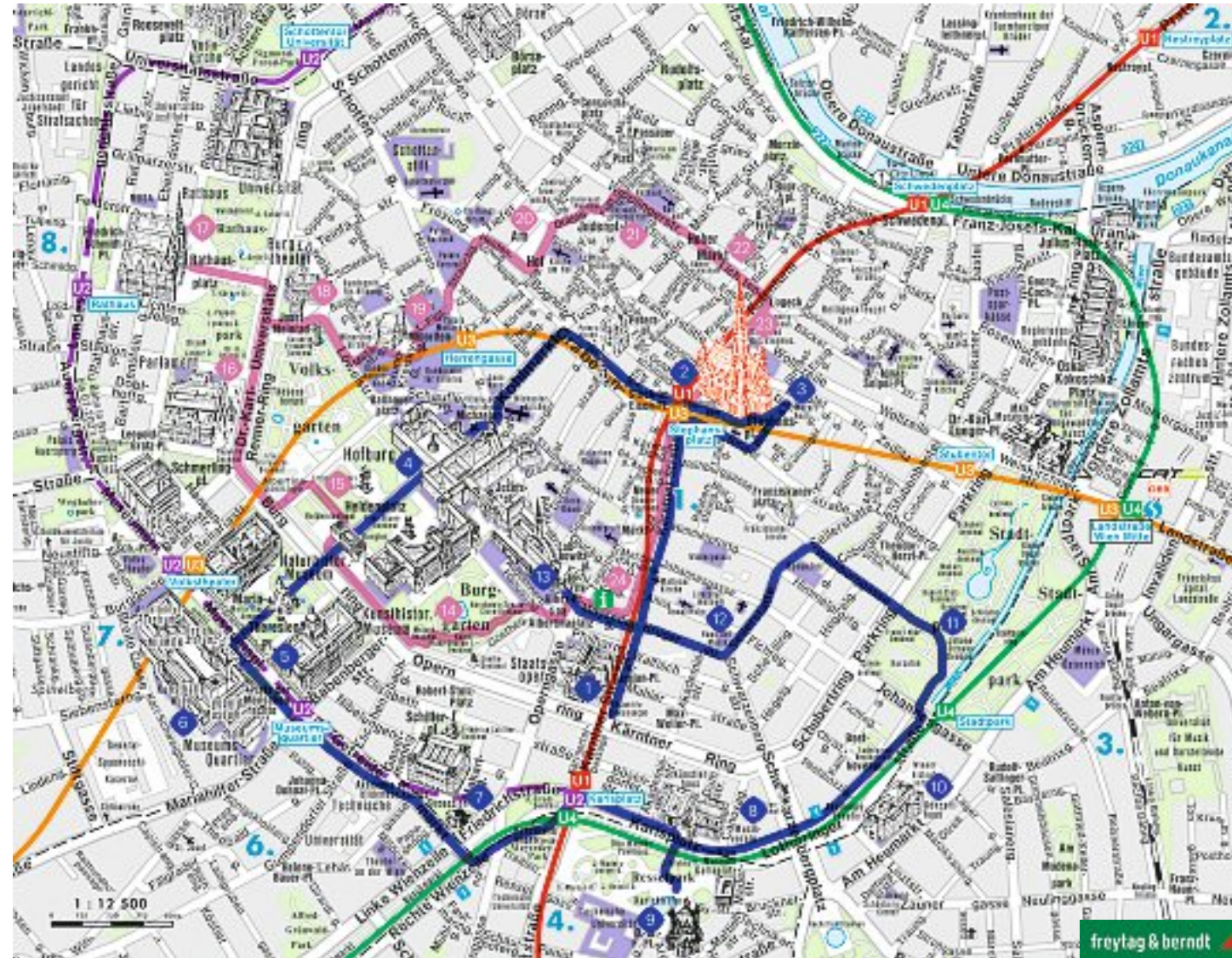
Belvedere Palace: Prince Eugene's Baroque palace and formal gardens, art museum with works from the Middle Ages to the present day, featuring the world's largest Gustav Klimt collection (incl. The Kiss); directions: Tram D; Station: Schloss Belvedere

Hundertwasser Haus/Kunst Haus Wien – Museum Hundertwasser: Unusual apartment building and museum with a changing line-up of exhibitions; directions: Tram 1, O; Station Radetzkyplatz

Prater/Giant Ferris Wheel: Leafy oasis of greenery and amusement park with restaurants; directions: U1, U2, Tram O, or S-Bahn; Station: Praterstern

Kahlenberg/Leopoldsberg: Vienna's landmark hills with vineyards and impressive views of the city below; directions: Bus 38A from Heiligenstadt; Station: Kahlenberg or Leopoldsberg

Viennese heuriger: Authentic wine taverns with Viennese delicacies; heuriger areas: Neustift, Heiligenstadt, Sievering, Grinzing, Nussdorf; directions: Heiligenstadt, Grinzing: U4 to Heiligenstadt, then Bus 38A or 39A; Neustift am Walde: 35A, Nussdorf: Tram D

Belvedere Palace

City Walk II

Starting at **Burggarten** 14, walk past the imperial Hofburg towards **Heldenplatz** 15. On the other side of the Ringstrasse from the Volksgarten – where Sisi fans will find a Jugendstil (Austrian Art Nouveau) monument to the Empress – is the **Parliament** 16 building, with the Pallas Athene fountain in front of it. The shaded **Rathauspark** 17 is a relaxing place to take a break with its fountains, statues, and exotic trees. Across the Ringstrasse from City Hall is the **Burgtheater** 18 – one of the leading theaters in the German-speaking world. From there it's worth taking a look at the nearby **Minoritenkirche** 19 church, where you will find a giant mosaic copy of Leonardo da Vinci's Last Supper that was commissioned by Napoleon Bonaparte. Walk along Freyung, at one time home to street entertainers and brash market traders, until you reach **Am Hof** 20 – one of the most architecturally significant sites in the whole of the old town. Excavation works for an underground garage beneath the square in the 1960s turned up the remains of a Roman settlement here. The most striking building on Am Hof is the Kirche Zu den neun Chören der Engel, a beautiful Gothic church with a Baroque façade. Via **Judenplatz** 21, designated as a place of remembrance (holocaust memorial, excavations of the medieval synagogue, museum on Jewish life in the Middle Ages), you will reach **Hoher Markt** 22 with the famous Anker Clock (figures parade at noon each day). Then proceed to the area around the Ruprechtskirche church. A short walk will then bring you to Vienna's most famous landmark, the Gothic **St. Stephen's Cathedral** 23. Any questions? Head down the Kärntnerstrasse, lined with stores and traditional boutiques, to our Tourist Info 24 on the **Albertinaplatz**.
