

International City Vienna

Vienna is a city that is synonymous with a high quality of life. This is regularly confirmed by official rankings. Vienna has been at the top of prestigious city rankings compiled by the Economist Intelligence Unit¹ and the consulting firm Mercer² for many years. This explains why international organizations and leading global corporations feel so at home here. However, Vienna is not only a city of global importance as a location for corporate headquarters; it also stands out as a hub of knowledge and a meeting destination.

Vienna's Donau City, home to many well-known companies as well as numerous UN organizations, is considered the heart of the "Headquarters City". The United Nations has defined Vienna as one of its four official seats and is represented here with numerous organizations. The IAEA (International Atomic Energy Agency) and OPEC (Petroleum Exporting Countries) also have their headquarters in the city. In total, international institutions secure almost 20,000 jobs in Vienna³. 183 multinational corporations take advantage of Vienna as an ideal location for servicing Central and Eastern Europe. Illustrious Austrian companies such as Wienerberger AG and OMV have also selected Vienna for the head offices of their groups.

The city's high quality of life and safety are reasons why international companies and organizations choose Vienna as a location to do business. The multinational flair contributes to Vienna being highly regarded around the world by congress organizers and participants alike. The conference statistics for 2025 show that 7,196 conferences and corporate events took place, with a total of 2,545 44 million guest nights, accounting for 13% of Vienna's total guest volume. In the Union of International Associations (UIA)⁴ 2025 Congress Ranking, Vienna ranks first worldwide, ahead of Brussels. In the ranking of the ICCA (International Congress and Convention Association), Vienna can always be found towards the top of the list: in 2025, Vienna took 4th place in the ICCA analysis of worldwide (association) congresses.⁵ In addition to excellent accessibility and outstanding services for event organizers, Vienna – a premier meeting destination – offers attractive venues such as the imperial Hofburg Vienna, the Austria Center Vienna, and the VIECON – Vienna Convention & Congress Center.

Vienna's importance as a city of knowledge is another motive for many organizers to bring their conference to Vienna. With a research ratio of 4.0%,⁶ Vienna is one of the leading regions in the EU. Around 50,000 people are employed in research and development. The number of research companies in the city has more than doubled in the past 15 years. And with around 197,000 students, Vienna – together with Berlin – is the biggest university city in the German-speaking countries⁷. The mdw – University of Music and Performing Arts Vienna is one of the best music universities in the

world⁸. Since fall 2019, the Central European University has been boosting the knowledge hub of Vienna with an additional campus. The campus of the Vienna University of Economics and Business, the Neu Marx Research and Technology Center with the Vienna BioCenter, the campus of Vienna University and Siemens City also generate significant stimuli in the field of research.

The international character of the city is based on its cosmopolitanism, which in turn is rooted in the multicultural make-up of Vienna's population. A stroll through one of Vienna's markets, such as the Naschmarkt, illustrates this as clearly as a glance at traditional Viennese cuisine. The dishes found there from every country that once belonged to the Austro-Hungarian Empire and offer a delicious testament to cultural diversity. Vienna is currently a home and place of employment for people from all parts of the world, around one third of Viennese were born outside Austria and almost 50%⁹ of the two million residents¹⁰ have a "migrant background" – in other words, both parents were born abroad, with members of the First Generation having been born abroad and members of the Second Generation having been born in Austria¹¹.

- Vienna has been one of the four official seats of the United Nations and home to more than a dozen of UN organizations, IAEA and OPEC, OSZE (seat of the secretariat in Vienna since 1995) as well as numerous other international organizations – with almost 20,000 employees – for over 40 years (Source: www.bmeia.gv.at/themen/wien-als-sitz-internationaler-organisationen)

- Vienna accounts for around 30% of Austria's total research expenditure, and Vienna's research ratio (meaning the expenditure on research and development) is 4.0 %, making the city one of the leading regions in the EU (source: Wien in Zahlen, Forschung und Entwicklung 2024)
- Around 51,000 people work in Vienna in the field of research (Source: Wien in Zahlen, Forschung und Entwicklung 2024)
- 26 universities (universities of education, universities of applied science, and private universities (Source: www.wien.gv.at/bildung/hochschulen/)
