

Vienna: Mozart, Strauss and DJ Sounds

Night after night in Vienna, music fans are treated to live classical music. The Vienna concert schedule includes thousands of events of various sizes and genres over the course of the year. No other city has been home to so many composers – Mozart, Mahler, Haydn, Beethoven and Johann Strauss, the Waltz King, all worked in the city. The Vienna Philharmonic and the Vienna Boys Choir set a world-leading benchmark, while the State Opera House and the Golden Hall at the Musikverein are among the world's leading venues. Traditional strengths endure to this day – the electronic sound pioneered by local musicians and leading DJs enjoys worldwide popularity.

Vienna is the world capital of music: every year, the Vienna Philharmonic Orchestra's New Year's Concert delights around 50 million TV viewers in more than 90 countries. The Vienna Boys' Choir, which has its own concert hall called "MuTh" in the Augarten, celebrates its success on every continent. And the Vienna Symphony Orchestra are making quite a name for themselves. The city has two concert halls of international standing, the Vienna Music Society (Musikverein) and the Konzerthaus. The city is also the ideal setting for a high-caliber range of festivals, whether it be ancient music at Resonanzen, contemporary compositions at Wien Modern, the Vienna Festival or the Summer Nights concert by the Vienna Philharmonic. The stars of tomorrow can be seen at 1,300 events of the mdw – University of Music and Performing Arts Vienna – one of the best music universities in the world.

The world-famous Vienna State Opera offers performances 300 nights a year and a different billing virtually every day. The MusikTheater an der Wien has established a name for itself as "the other" venue for opera and is noted for premieres of compositions ranging from the baroque to the contemporary. The Volksoper presents classic operas, lively operettas and countless musicals in German. Fans of musicals can also enjoy Maria Theresia – Das Musical at the Ronacher Theater and The Phantom of the Opera at the Raimund Theater. Summertime entertainment is celebrated every evening on the square in front of the City Hall - with free music films and a wide range of culinary delights.

Numerous music festivals are dedicated to specific genres just waiting to be discovered: Das Akkordeon-Festival lässt über die Vielseitigkeit des Instruments staunen, der Vienna Blues Spring ist das weltweit längste Blues-Festival, die Afrika Tage Wien präsentieren Weltmusik und Wien im Rosenstolz das Wienerlied. The KlezMore Festival is all about Jewish klezmer music, the Vienna Jazzfloor invites visitors to 130 concerts in nine of the city's clubs, while Voice Mania is totally committed to a-cappella music.

Such a musical and creative atmosphere is an ideal breeding ground for contemporary music: clubs such as Flucc, Pratersauna and Grelle Forelle play the electronic sounds of local musicians such as Wolfram, Ogris Debris and HVOB, who are also making waves on the international scene.

The musical styles are more diverse than ever: A new generation of German-language pop has also long since established itself with Bilderbuch, Wanda and others.

The pop festival brings the latest trends in Austrian music to the stage on Karlsplatz. The soundtrack for the Gürtel Nightwalk is laid down by bands at the vanguard of the indie and electronic scene. The Danube Island Festival, Europe's largest open-air festival with free admission, pulls in well over two million visitors each year with acts from a host of genres on the billing. Vienna's club festival Waves Vienna presents more than 100 live acts ranging from alternative to electronic to Rock over three days. www.vienna.info

- The Vienna Boys Choir: the oldest boys choir in the world (founded in 1498). The training and choral traditions of the Vienna Boys’ Choir have been inscribed on the UNESCO list of Intangible Cultural Heritage in Austria. 90 active Viennese choristers make up four concert choirs that perform in front of almost half a million people at roughly 300 events every year. The Vienna Girls’ Choir was formed in 2004, and in June 2024 they were awarded the European Culture Prize jointly with the Vienna Boys’ Choir. (Source: [Vienna Boys’ Choir](#))
